NOTES FROM THE DRAMATURG

LIPSTICK TRACES is best described as a punk rock historical extravaganza. Based on the book by Greil Marcus titled *Lipstick Traces: A Secret History* of the 20th Century, this play follows the Narrator as she attempts to connect the nihilistic impulse from Heretics in the 16th century to the formation of the infamous band the Sex Pistols in the 1970s. With many mistakes and re-dos, the actors reenact the Narrator's understanding of the 20th century, guiding us through movements that many claim never left a trace. From Dada to Johnny Rotten, this fast-paced electric show is sure to keep audiences on the edge of their seats, so make sure to pay attention.

DADA

DADA was an artistic and literary movement that began in Zürich, Switzerland at the Cabaret Voltaire in 1916. It began as a reaction to World War I and extreme nationalism that they believed to have led to the war and lasted from 1916 to roughly 1924. This artistic movement consisted of artists who rejected the logic, reason, and aestheticism of modern capitalist society, instead expressing nonsense, irrationality, and anti-bourgeois protest in their works.

RICHARD HUELSENBECK (April 1892 – April 1974) was a German writer, poet, psychoanalyst, and founding member of the Dada movement.

HUGO BALL (February 1886 – September 1927) was a German author, poet, and one of the founding members of the Dada movement.

TRISTAN TZARA (April 1896 – December 1963) was a Romanian and French poet, essayist, journalist, playwright, composer, film director, and one of the founding members of the Dada movement.

LETTRISTS/SITUATIONISTS

The **LETTERIST INTERNATIONAL (LI)** was a Paris based collective of radical artists and cultural theorists between 1952 and 1957.

The **SITUATIONIST INTERNATIONAL (SI)** was formed as a segue off of the Letterist International and again was an international organization made up of avant-guard artists, intellectuals, and political theorists from 1957 to 1972.

GUY DEBORD (December 1931 – November 1994) was a French Marxist theorist, philosopher, filmmaker, member of the Letterist International, and founding member of the Situationist International.

SEX PISTOLS

The **SEX PISTOLS** were an English punk rock band that formed in London in 1975. Although their initial career lasted just two and a half years, they are one of the most groundbreaking acts in the history of popular music.

MALCOLM MCLAREN (January 1946 – April 2010) was an English visual artist, singer, songwriter, musician, clothes designer, and boutique owner. He is best known as a promoter and manager of bands the New York Dolls and the Sex Pistols.

JOHNNY ROTTEN (Born January 31) is an English singer and songwriter who is best known as the lead singer of the late-1970s British punk band the Sex Pistols. Known for a big ego and anarchist beliefs. Real name is John Lydon.

STEVE JONES (Born 1955) is an English rock guitarist and radio DJ. He was a guitarist with the Sex Pistols and later formed The Professionals with former bandmate Paul Cook after the Sex Pistols break-up.

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


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UPCOMING PRODUCTION

This play contains some adult language and content.


